



Aurora Global Income Trust (ASX Code: AIB) Performance Report - September 2011

Summary

- The Trust returned 0.61% for September compared to the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index which returned 0.39%
- The Fund announced a cash distribution of \$0.0295 for the three months ending 30 September 2011, which represents an annualised yield of 10.05%

The above composite/hybrid performance summary reflects a combination of the performance of the investment strategy as it applied (net of fees) within the former Aurora Sandringham Global Income Trust (ARSN 131 291 499 - now terminated) since its inception in July 2008 to August 2011, and then the performance of this Trust (which implemented the same strategy) since 30 November 2010 to date. This is not the actual performance of Aurora Global Income Trust (AIB). The actual return of AIB since inception is 2.82% p.a. The table above and the charts below refer to the performance of the composite/hybrid strategy and not of the actual performance of AIB.

Investment Objective*

To provide investors with steady income returns after fees and expenses in excess of the UBS Australia Bank Bill Index over rolling three year periods while protecting their capital. Please note that while we aim to achieve this objective, the returns are not guaranteed.

Investment Strategy

To take advantage of global companies that Aurora expects will increase in value relative to the market around the announcement of their quarterly, half-yearly and yearly earnings results while hedging their market and currency exposure.

Portfolio Commentary

From 1 September 2011, the Trust directly implemented the investment strategy rather than investing via Aurora Sandringham Global Income Trust (ARSN 131291499).

Global Equity markets continued to fall during September as doubts increased regarding the European Union's ability to resolve the sovereign debt crisis and limit the fallout from a near certain Greek default. Volatility remained extremely elevated as the markets were buffeted by constant news and rumours which included plans to leverage the European Financial Stability Facility (EFSF) to give it more firepower to restore financial stability. Concurrently, markets were also faced with the prospect of a global economic slowdown as disappointing manufacturing numbers out of China stoked fears of a hard landing.

Depressed equity prices provided good potential for upside earnings surprises. Accenture was the Trust's best performing position after the consulting company comfortably beat expectations as global themes including an increase in regulatory spend and a push towards greater cost efficiency drove demand for its services.

The Trust's weakest position was consumer electronics retailer Best Buy. The result disappointed in terms of both sales and margin as it struggles to compete with emerging online-only retailers.


